

WHEREFORE, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.



PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

I, Neal McAmis, a law enforcement officer, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law state as follows:

1. I have probable cause to believe that Kevin (NMI) Calip, B/M, DOB 09/21/74, SSN [REDACTED], committed one or more criminal offenses.
2. The following crime(s) happened on 11/03/09 @ 0753 at 1505 N. National in Springfield, Greene County, Missouri.
3. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

A witness (W1) said he was with the victim (V1) at Kum & Go at the above location. W1 said V1 went into to Kum & Go to purchase some items. W1 said he realized a white truck was behind his vehicle, blocking his vehicle on the parking lot. W1 said he saw the passenger, Calip, in the truck exit the vehicle and walk to the driver's side. He said Calip parked the vehicle in a parking spot. W1 said he then saw V1 and S2 talking just outside the front door of the business. W1 said it appeared the subjects were calm and were having a casual conversation when he said S2 suddenly punched V1 in the face. W1 said V1 went at S2 and said they fought each other. W1 said Calip then exited the truck and assisted S2 in the assault. W1 said S2 and Calip had V1 on the ground and were beating him up. W1 said he exited the vehicle and went toward S2 and Calip. He said as he approached them and said one of the subjects yelled, "come on!" W1 said the subjects went to their vehicle and fled the scene.

W1 said V1 had large cuts and gashes on his head, back, and arm. W1 said V1 had to have been cut by a weapon, but W1 admitted he never saw either suspect with a weapon. W1 said V1 bled profusely and said V1 got into their vehicle. He said he tried to take V1 to a hospital, but said he was not familiar with the area since he was not from Springfield. W1 said V1 saw a police officer at Benton/Central and was able to get the officer's attention. W1 said the officer was able to get medical attention for V1.

W1 told me he had no idea who the suspects were. He said he believed V1 knew the subjects, but W1 said he had never seen either subject before.

I responded to St. John's Hospital and contacted V1. I was able to speak with him briefly just before he went into surgery. He told me he knew the suspects and said their names were "Dre" (S2) and "Kevin" (Calip). V1 said he was not sure of their last names, but provided other information as to how the suspects could be located.

V1 said he had been in an ongoing dispute with the subjects over a video game. He said S2 borrowed the video game and had not returned it. He said he had attempted on multiple occasions to

get the video game back, but said S2 would not give it to him. V1 said he believed S2 had sold or stolen the video game.

V1 said he and W1 went to Kum & Go at 1505 N. National. He said he went inside the store to buy some items. He said when he was inside, he saw S2 enter the business. He said they exchanged words inside the business and said S2 followed him out. V1 told me when they got outside, S2 punched him. He said he attempted to fight back, but said Calip came and assisted S2. V1 said both Calip and S2 stabbed him. V1 admitted he did not see the subjects with weapons, but said he believed they both stabbed him because of the injuries and pain he had at the time of the assault. V1 said throughout the assault he tried to cover his face and prevent the subjects from harming him more. V1 said the subjects all of a sudden stopped assaulting him and said they fled in a white truck. V1 said the truck the subjects were in belonged to "B-Ray" (R1), a subject I knew from prior police contact.

V1 was taken to surgery at that time and I did not get to question him further.

I spoke with V1's girlfriend (R2). R2 told me she knew about the problems with V1, Calip, and S2. She also informed me the situation was about a video game that S2 had not returned to V1. R2 said she believed the subjects stalked V1 as she said there had been strange occurrences with the subjects in the last couple of days.

R2 said V1 had been at their residence on 11/02/09 when Calip, S2, and R1 showed up at the residence. R2 said V1 feared the subjects were going to break into the residence and said V1 called the police at that time (I later verified with dispatch that V1 had made a 911 call on 11/02/09 @ 1424 hours. The call notes said a subject was at the residence and would not leave. Officers arrived, the suspect was gone, and the officers cleared the call).

R2 said there was also another suspicious incident that happened this morning. She said a vehicle had been involved in a leaving the scene of an accident just a few houses down from their residence. She told me the vehicle involved in the crash was a vehicle commonly driven by Calip. R2 said there was no reason for Calip to be in the area at that time (I was able to locate and verify that report, report #09-48067). R2 provided information as to the possible whereabouts of the suspects.

I, along with Detective Cantrell, responded to a business owned by R1. We saw the suspect vehicle at that location, along with a subject that matched S2's description. We called for assistance from marked police units, who arrived on scene a short time later. We entered the business and contacted Calip and S2. I placed both subjects under arrest for first degree assault. When I arrested S2, he voluntarily told me he was inside R1's truck when the incident happened.

R1's truck was towed to the police department. I was later able to speak with R1, who consented to a search of the truck. The truck was processed at police headquarters and later returned to R1. Gloves were seized from the truck as possible evidence of the crime.

I spoke with S2 at police headquarters. S2 was advised of the Miranda Warnings and he said he understood them.

S2 admitted there was an ongoing dispute over the video game between him and V1. He said they had been in a previous physical altercation and said he had to kick V1 out of his (S2's) house at that time.

S2 said today's incident started when he saw V1 at the Kum & Go. He said he told V1 he had his game and said he asked V1 if V1 had his items. He said they got into an argument and went outside. S2 told me he balled up his fists and was ready to fight V1. He said, "we jumped him" and "smashed out." S2 said smashed out meant left the scene.

I asked S2 if the incident started with a verbal argument. He told me it did, but said he went there with the intent to fight. He said, "I was ready to fight." He also said, "I'm there to fight, straight up."

S2 said he was not sure who started the fight, but said he thought he swung at V1 and said V1 swung and was able to hit him. He said they were able to get V1 on the ground and assault him. S2 said only him and Calip assaulted V1 and said R1 was not involved. S2 said he had been driving R1's truck at the time of the incident, but said R1 was not there.

I questioned S2 about the severity of V1's wounds. He denied that any weapons were used during the incident. He admitted that he hit V1, but said he did not need weapons to beat up V1. S2 said he had gloves on during the fight and said he thought the material on the gloves could have caused the wounds to V1.

I continued to press S2 about the severity of the wounds and told him the wounds had to have been from a sharp instrument. When I pressed Carr about that, he told me he did not want to answer any other questions without a lawyer. The interview was ended at that time.

I attempted to question Calip about the incident, but he would not answer questions without a lawyer.

I called and spoke to a witness (W2) that was listed in the original police report. W2 told me he pulled onto the Kum & Go parking lot and saw a white Chevy Silverado that was behind a white Ford Expedition, blocking the Expedition in the parking space. He said Calip got out, got in the driver's seat, and parked the vehicle. W2 said he parked his vehicle and exited. W2 said he saw S2 follow V1 out of the business. He said S2 threw a punch at V1. W2 told me it appeared as if V1 tried to get away from S2, but said Calip came and also assaulted V1. W2 said both suspects repeatedly struck V1 throughout his body, but said he never saw either subject with a weapon.

W2 told me W1 exited the Expedition and approached the fight. He said that was when the subjects quit assaulting V1. W2 said one of the subjects said to W1, "what are you going to do?" W2 said the suspects fled the scene at that time. W2 told me W1 did not participate in the fight and said he did not see W1 get assaulted.


I spoke with another witness from the original report (W3). W3 told me she pulled onto the parking lot and saw the Silverado blocking the Expedition. She said Calip got out of the passenger seat of the Silverado and got into the driver's seat. W3 said she parked her car and did not know what Calip did with the vehicle.

W3 said she exited her car and the next thing she saw was Calip and S2 "attacking" V1. W3 said W1 exited the Expedition and approached the fight. She said it appeared W1 tried to help V1. She said the suspects fled when W1 approached them.

Officer Whitaker responded to the crime scene and was able to view preliminary video evidence at the Kum & Go (a copy was not able to be obtained at that point). Officer Whitaker noted that the suspect vehicle pulled in behind the Expedition. He said the driver exited and put the hood of his shirt on his head. He said the passenger exited, got in the driver's seat, and moved the vehicle to a parking space. He said that subject also exited the vehicle and walked toward the front doors of the business. He said there is apparent body movement, but said the camera he viewed did not capture the assault.

I again spoke with R2 and got an update of V1's injuries. She said he had been released from the hospital, but said he was sleeping from the medication he was on and could not talk.

The facts contained above are true.




