3. The information that leads me to believe the above person committed the above offense is as follows:

This incident occurred in Pulaski County, Missouri.

About 0745, March 26, 2008 Deputy Brandon Robertson was dispatched to 14145 Howard Lane, Dixon, Missouri concerning a report of shots fired and injuries. Upon his arrival, Deputy Robertson observed Stacy Powell lying on the ground on the shoulder of the road in front of 14101 Howard Lane. Stacy Powell was bleeding from the left wrist and was visibly agitated. Lying on the ground next to her was Brian Powell (W/M, DOB 05-31-1965, SSAN ██████████, residing at 14145 Howard Lane, Dixon, MO) who was not responsive verbal stimulus. Deputy Robertson checked Brian Powell and determined he had a gunshot entry wound in his upper left chest, and no exit wound. Deputy Robertson made initial contact with Stacy and she made a spontaneous statement that she "should have shot myself, not my husband." Brian Powell was transported to the General Leonard Wood Army Community Hospital, Fort Leonard Wood, Mo where he died without regaining consciousness.

Prior to Deputy Robertson's arrival, a passerby, who identified herself as a registered nurse, stated that Brian Powell was observed with a "sucking chest wound" to the left chest. The nurse stated that when she began to treat Brian Powell, he was still conscious and made the statement to her "she shot me." Brian Powell further told the nurse that his wife had been at the residence for two days. The nurse stated she also heard Stacy Powell who was lying on the ground state "just let me die, I want to die."

An interview of Mr. Curtis A. Steele (B/M, DOB 10-09-1960, residing at 14101 Howard Lane) revealed that about 0735, March 26, 2008 he observed Brian running up the street from 14145 in the direction of 14101 and

tackle Stacy Powell in the street. Steele stated he observed Brian Powell grab the weapon away from Stacy Powell and throw the weapon into the yard of 14101. Deputy Robertson recovered a Taurus 40 caliber semi automatic pistol from the front yard of 14101 Howard Lane. Upon clearing the weapon, Robertson determined there was an expended shell casing lodged in the weapon. The magazine for the weapon was similarly found in the yard and was determined to be loaded with 11 live rounds of ammunition.

Detective Hayden briefly spoke to Stacy Powell at the crime scene while being treated and although she was not very responsive, when asked the question, "What happened" Stacy Powell replied "me and my husband were fussing" and she then became non responsive. No further questions were asked.

Detective Hayden and Sgt Michael Denney conducted an exterior crime scene examination. The search revealed two distinct trails of suspected blood. The first, from the front door of the residence in a northeasterly direction to a location on the shoulder of the road in front of 14101 Howard Lane. The second trail led from the rear entrance, around the residence and disappeared in the lawn of 14145 Howard Lane.

Pursuant to a search warrant being issued for a crime scene examination of 14145 Howard Lane, Detective Hayden and Sgt Denney conducted a crime scene examination. The examination revealed that in the kitchen on the main floor of the house, there was a suspected blood trail leading from the kitchen to the front door. About 10 feet inside the residence near the front door was a kitchen "paring" knife with blood on it. The suspected blood trail then continued out the door and met up with the exterior trail. In the basement of the residence there was a bullet hole in the wall of the family room, which traveled through the wall into a downstairs bedroom and lodged in the exterior wall of the residence. Attempts to locate the projectile in the wall met with unsuccessful results. There was an expended shell casing on the floor of the family room. There were also several areas of suspected blood on the floor of the living room, and suspected blood spatter on the glass door leading to the rear of the house. The interior downstairs trail met up with the exterior trail. It appeared two shots had been fired, one that missed and one that struck Brian in the upper left quadrant.

A search of Stacy Powell's 2008 Dodge Avenger, Vehicle Identification Number 1B31C76M38N688020, revealed a plastic bag in the trunk, which contained a receipt from the purchase of a Taurus PT24 .40 caliber pistol, serial number SZJ28610, and 2 boxes of ammunition. The purchase was made on March 17, 2008 at Kirk's Gun Shop, El Paso, Texas.

Cpl. Beasley viewed the postmortem examination of Brian's body. The pathologist, Dr. Keith Norton, said initial examination of the projectile entry injury had soot and an abrasion ring, which is consistent with a close contact wound. During the exam, it was discovered the bullet had entered the upper left quadrant of the chest, damaged the left lung, the spleen, the diaphragm, and the stomach. The bullet then exited the rib cage area and lodged near the skin of the lower back.

Sheriff Department records show a child dispute between Brian and Stacy Powell on 12/30/07. Sheriff's Department records also show a citation was issued on 12/30/07 for traveling one hundred six miles per hour in a seventy mile per hour area. Court records show a dissolution of marriage filed on 02/14/08 by Brian and one filed by Stacy on 02/05/08.
