Section III: Narrative Description of Initiatives Undertaken during this year. (Include dates of job-fairs, names of station employees who attended short description of activities that occurred, etc.)

Fisher Broadcasting Inc., licensee of KATU TV in Portland Oregon is offering the “Thomas R Dargan” scholarship to students who are minority citizens of the United States. A minority is defined as Native American, African American, Hispanic or Asian. An applicant must be enrolled in the first, second, or third year of a broadcast of communications curriculum at a four-year college or university or an accredited community college in Oregon or Washington. An applicant must have a minimum 3.00 GPA. Scholarships are based on need, academic achievement and personal qualities.

The deadline for applications is April 30th. Applications were available via our website at KATU.com and we sent our brochures to a list of schools in the Pacific Northwest. KATU awarded 2 scholarships during 2006. These recipients are eligible for a paid internship in selected departments at Fisher Broadcasting/KATU. This scholarship will again be awarded at the same time next year.

Fisher Broadcasting Inc., licensee of KATU TV also offers a year-round college internship program for students who have identified their career goals in broadcasting. The applicant must be a Junior or Senior at a four year university, with preference given to students majoring in communications related fields. During October 1, 2005 to September 30, 2006, we had a total of 12 internships. They were as follows: AM Northwest had 1 intern during spring 2006, 3 interns during summer 2006. The Sports Department had 1 intern
